



## 03.01 PRACTITIONER DEVELOPMENT

- › Contributing to the professional development and career expansion of South Australian screen practitioners. Practitioner Development funding provides financial support to local practitioners to attend relevant events and conferences and network with key industry stakeholders to market projects.

<b>what events are eligible?</b>	<p>Workshops, conferences, courses or other industry related events that:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>/ provide professional development or career enhancement and</li><li>/ develop the applicant's skills and ability to contribute to and work within the South Australian industry.</li></ul> <p>Events that are already supported by the South Australian Film Corporation through Screen Culture or other funding initiatives are not eligible for Practitioner Development funding.</p>
<b>who is eligible?</b>	<p>South Australian based writers, producers, directors and digital media practitioners who have projects in development and will benefit from expanding their professional networks and skills at national industry courses, conferences and events.</p> <p>Eligible applicants will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>/ have a relevant track record</li><li>/ demonstrate a commitment to working in the South Australian film, television or digital media industry and</li><li>/ have a minimum of one relevant project in development</li></ul> <p>Preference will be given to applicants who have organised relevant industry meetings in conjunction with the event in order to market their projects.</p>
<b>what is offered?</b>	<p>Funding up to \$1,000 per applicant. Funding includes:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>/ a maximum of 50% of the course fee/early bird registration fee and</li><li>/ up to \$300 towards economy airfare costs (if applicable)</li></ul>
<b>what special conditions apply?</b>	<p>In addition to the assessment criteria detailed in the General Guidelines, the applications will be assessed on:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>/ the appropriateness of the event in relation to the applicant's career development and portfolio of projects</li><li>/ the level of development of each project and its readiness to attract market place finance</li><li>/ the profile of the event and its demonstrable relevance to key areas of local development and</li><li>/ for interstate events, the relevance of the industry meetings to project/s.</li></ul> <p>Application Conditions</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>/ Other costs of the professional development opportunity, such as accommodation, meals, taxis and other expenses, are not covered by the fund.</li><li>/ Practitioner Development funding is made available as a grant and is non-recoupable, however should the applicant be unable to attend the event, the grant must be returned to the South Australian Film Corporation in full.</li></ul>

- / Successful applicants are required to submit a detailed report within 21 days of the event's conclusion, covering the outcome of the course, workshop, conference or event and any industry meetings held, detailing the benefits to the applicant's career.
- / The South Australian Film Corporation may call for applications to targeted events, for which a maximum amount available to each successful applicant will be fixed. A specific deadline for targeted call outs will be advertised. Applications for targeted events will not be accepted after this date.
- / Funding for targeted events may include accommodation costs in addition to registration fees and airfares as specified in each individual call out.
- / Applicants may receive Practitioner Development funding up to three (3) times in any financial year. The South Australian Film Corporation will not support an applicant's attendance at the same event on any more than three (3) consecutive occasions.

<b>how do I apply?</b>	The application process is detailed in the General Guidelines. Application forms are available online at <a href="http://www.safilm.com.au">www.safilm.com.au</a> After reading the General Guidelines and confirming eligibility, applicants are required to discuss their applications with the appropriate Industry Development and Production project officer prior to submitting an application.
<b>when can I apply?</b>	Applications will be accepted at any time. To be eligible, however, Practitioner Development funding applications must be submitted to the South Australian Film Corporation at least 20 business days prior to the event.
