Speaker: Waeel Nassereddine, 1st Assistant Director



New to the SAFC and the screen industry this year, Tyme has worked across a variety of sectors, most recently in senior policy and advisory roles advocating for high level strategic business outcomes in government and not-for-profit settings that impact positively on Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people, projects, and initiatives. Passionate about film and television from an early age, Tyme has a Bachelor of Arts in Screen, Media and Australian Studies from Flinders University.



Speaker: Jai Sumner-Koncz, emerging SA screen practitioner

Jai is a proud Ngarrindjeri man and emerging screen artist. After starting his company First Nations Creative Collective in 2022, Jai entered the screen industry through his love of VR and storytelling when he was selected for the SAFC Centralised Immersive Storytelling VR Lab, a VR workshop for First Nations storytellers facilitated by expert UK mentors. Jai has since taken part in the SAFC and Channel 44 First Nations TV Pilot Workshop this year, which included being a part of a writers' room under the guidance of Pauline Clague, Adrian Russell Wills and Lisa Scott. This resulted in a unique chance to complete an Attachment working with Endemol Shine in Broken Hill on TV series *Royal Flying Doctor Service -RFDS S2*, Australia's second biggest TV drama series.
