Support for SA practitioners to attend AIDC 2020

Australian International Documentary Conference (AIDC) is the Asia-Pacific's premier event for documentary, specialist factual and unscripted entertainment.

Featuring a four-day marketplace, ideas forum and public screening program, AIDC attracts a dynamic mix of broadcasters, storytellers, entrepreneurs and documentary fans from all over the world. It aims to connect creators, purveyors and viewers of nonfiction screen content in ways that promote business, inspire creativity and ignite social change.

AIDC 2020 will take place at the State Library, Melbourne, Victoria from 1 - 4 March 2020.

What is on offer?

The South Australian Film Corporation will support up to 10 South Australian factual film makers to attend the AIDC 2020.

SAFC will provide funding of \$410 (excl. GST) to successful applicants to purchase an All Access Pass, which will be available at a lower rate of \$810 (excl. GST). SAFC funding is equivalent to approximately 50% of the full cost of the pass.

Who is eligible?

South Australian resident film makers with prior experience in documentary and factual storytelling. Practitioners applying must have at least one current factual project in development to be considered for this funding.

In line with SAFC's ongoing commitment to increasing screen industry diversity, we encourage participants from under-represented groups to apply for this opportunity.

The SAFC is committed to supporting increased participation in the industry of people from under-represented groups including women, Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples, practitioners from Culturally and Linguistically Diverse backgrounds, those Deaf or with disability, from LGBTQIA+ communities and from regional and remote areas.

In alignment with these policies, practitioners from the ATSI community, regional or remote areas or those requiring additional access support are strongly encouraged to contact a Funding Officer to discuss the potential for additional funding to support travel and accommodation costs.

How will my application be assessed?

This funding round will be assessed competitively.

Applications will be assessed on:

- The applicant's demonstrated commitment to a career in the factual screen industry;
- The degree to which the applicant has engaged with/or intends to engage with, the marketplace opportunities at AIDC 2019;
- The applicant's professional development and project goals for conference attendance;
- The current factual project under development.

The online application form will require you to include:

- A short description of one project you will be pitching at the conference;
- A current CV;
- Online links to previous creative work or showreel (if available).

How do I apply?

Submit your application through the SAFC's online grant portal at <https://safilm.smartygrants.com.au/>
Before you apply, please familiarise yourself with the SAFC's Terms of Trade.

Applications close on Monday 2 December at 11.59pm ACST.
Successful applicants will be notified via email by Monday 9 December.

Successful applicants will enter into a grant agreement with the SAFC and provide a valid invoice for the payment of the grant. After the conference, the attendees will need to submit an acquittal within 30 days.

The decision on applications is final.
