# First Nations TV Pilot Program















<u>The First Nations TV Pilot Program</u> is a television writing skills development initiative for First Nations South Australian screen talent.

The program has been designed by SAFC First Nations Screen Strategy Executive, Pauline Clague and will be delivered in partnership with Channel 44. The program is supported through the Screenrights Cultural Fund and Screen Australia's First Nations Department.

#### What is on offer?

Phase 1 of the initiative will support up to 15 First Nations screen makers to undertake a Story Development Training program. Leading First Nations industry mentors Leah Purcell, Adrian Wills and SAFC First Nations Strategy Executive Pauline Clague will assist all participants across a sixweek program, delivered online, where they will learn how to create television pitch documents and write a pilot episode script.

At the end of the training stage, each participant will have the opportunity to pitch their project via an application process. Six of the projects will then be selected by the funding partners to undertake a writers room. The writers room will be a 3 day workshop to help flesh out and create the pilot episode for your series. The writers room will take place at Channel 44.

### Who is eligible?

The SAFC is seeking applications from early career First Nations writers who are South Australian residents. Applicants are not required to have prior screen industry credits; however the program is competitive and applicants must be able to demonstrate a commitment to working in television production.

## What projects are eligible?

This program is for original episodic television projects of any genre that demonstrate a strong authorial voice, authentic storytelling and independent spirit.

Projects are expected to be wholly produced and post-produced in South Australia.

## Who is not eligible?

Applicants based outside of South Australia are not eligible for this program.

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## How will applications be assessed?

- The originality and creative ambition of the concept
- The overall quality of the pitch materials
- The commitment of the applicant to further their television career
- The benefits of the program to the applicant's career development
- The willingness of the applicant to engage in the TV Pilot Initiative and to work professionally and to a high technical standard within the timeframe (as demonstrated by the Professional Development Statement)

Applications will be made in the form of an Expression of Interest to the SAFC.

The Expression of Interest is available via the online grants portal <u>safilm.smartygrants.com.au</u>

Applicants are encouraged to discuss their application with the SAFC prior to applying.

Successful and unsuccessful applicants will be notified by email.

No late applications will be considered. Decisions on applications will be final.

- A completed Expression of Interest form via Smarty Grants
- A **short summary** of your idea (up to 3 pages)
- A short bio
- Please include: your name, your current job title, your hometown, your professional goals and any relevant achievements in the screen industry or arts industry
- A Professional Development Statement
- Tell us how this program will help you to achieve your goal of becoming a television writer/showrunner
- Examples/links to previous work

### **Funding Conditions**

Intellectual Property created in relation to a project will be held by the First Nations program participant that applied with and originated that project.

In line with industry standards, it is a condition of participating in this program that, if there is collaborative work and for the Writers' Room, collaborators will be required to assign their Intellectual Property to the project's originator and owner.
