

The South Australian Film Corporation has continued to partner with Adelaide's free to air community broadcaster Channel 44 to create pathways for early career First Nations screen makers.

The partnership includes support for up to two interns to be mentored across key creative and crew roles. Each internship requires up to 80 hours of unpaid work that will include hands-on experience in television production. Interns will learn production skills and have the opportunity to create original content.

Channel 44 has a social media following of 10,000 people with 65,000 audience viewership within Adelaide and SA regional towns. Channel 44 delivers regular TV programming including *SA Sports Show* at 3 hours per week and *Our Time* at 2 hours per week.

What is on offer?

Up to five internships will be created for interns to be mentored by experienced Channel 44 staff. Mentoring will occur across production, on set and within the production office.

Positions available for internships across multiple roles include:

- Operations Assistant (Production Assistant)
- Web Development
- Production Coordinator
- Social Media and Marketing
- Broadcast Assistant (Production Assistant)
- Editor/VFX/Animation
- Other casual production crew opportunities - hair, makeup, wardrobe.

Participants will receive a \$1,000 stipend to undertake the internship.

Who is eligible?

- Applicants must identify as being Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander
- Applicants must be a South Australian Resident as defined by the SAFC Terms of Trade.
- Applicants must demonstrate a commitment to a career in screen. Evidence of previous credits (preferable)
- As a variation to the SAFC Terms of Trade tertiary students are eligible to apply for this program.

Expectations of the participants

- Commitment to 80 hours of Internship with Channel 44.
- Office based preferred 9am-5pm x 1 day per week, but hours may be flexible as negotiated with Channel 44.
- Some weekend and out of hours work is required.
- Ability to work as part of a team.

Selection Procedure

Applications will need to undergo an Interview with Channel 44
